The United Methodist Book of Discipline and the Policy and Procedure Manual of the Baltimore Washington Conference of the United Methodist Church provide for and encourage a time of renewal leave for clergy under appointment once every seventh year. The purpose is a time of rest, renewal, reflection, and preparation to return refreshed and invigorated for ministry.

I will be celebrating twenty years under appointment on July 1, 2025 and am pleased to be reappointed to Trinity United Methodist Church for at least the 2025-2026 liturgical year. Appointments are affirmed and fixed at the Annual Conference each year. In twenty years, I have never taken a Pastoral Renewal Leave. The time and need are now.

In consultation and advisement of District Superintendent Rev. Dr. Johnsie Cogman, and with the support of Trinity UMC's Staff Pastor Parish Relations Committee, the body charged with care of the pastor and family among many other responsibilities, and after deep prayer, I applied for and have been granted a ninety-day Renewal leave effective June 1, 2025 until September 1, 2025.

Pastoral Leave is not considered vacation time or sick time. It is a time of rest, renewal, prayer, discernment, and preparation to return invigorated to be a better pastor, focused on the Vision and Mission of Trinity United Methodist Church and the call to serve as a connected Elder in the BWC of the United Methodist Church. The time will be spent reconnecting to the plan God called me to fulfill in the power of the Holy Spirit to make effective Disciples for the transformation of the world. While on Renewal Leave, I will be completely disconnected from any service to Trinity UMC or any other pastoral function. Therefore, I am not to be contacted in any way for any reason, nor will I answer or make any calls, emails, visits, or any other pastoral responsibilities during this time.

I am very thankful to the several persons, including Pastor Rob Carter, who will be providing excellent pulpit coverage. Trinity has an exciting series of faithful servants stepping up to fill this responsibility. In addition, Pastor Rob is one of several Calvert County Clergy who will be providing emergency coverage while I am away. A complete schedule of clergy filling these responsibilities is in the church office, and on file with our SPPRC chair Ruthie Lewis, and our District Superintendent Rev. Dr. Johnsie Cogman.

I covet your prayers and continued love and support while I am on Renewal Leave. I also look forward to many years of renewed service with you here at Trinity and in our community, to God be the Glory. Any questions should be directed to our SPPRC, including Ruthie Lewis, Eric Pfeiffer, Jimmy Wojciechowski, Dan Wells, Connie Cosgrove, Rob Kimmel, Caydee Haire and Lay Leader Laure Yax.

Our Christian siblings in the Navajo Nation ask for our prayers as they plan this time for people to come together and remember Anthony (the former evangelist of the congregation) and help to share the Word with those on the reservation.

Anthony made an impact on many people that travelled to Rough Side of the Mountain on Mission teams in past years. He was the leader of the team that came to Trinity when they drove across the country to be with us for a visit in 2012. His presence is greatly missed in the Rough Side of the Mountain community.

They have requested prayer from our church family for the planning of this revival that 'everything will be taken care of and that the revival will touch the lives of people that attend this summer'.

Our contingent will represent Trinity and the many mission teams that have gone to the Navajo Nation over the past 20 years. Providing food & helping prepare some meals to be served nightly after revival will be how we support the Light in the Mountain community on this trip. They plan to have VBS activities for children during the revivals and Trinity has generously sent materials for the VBS program and craft supplies. ANNUAL CONFERENCE REPORT

Annual Conference's guiding scripture, Philippians 4:4-9

Brothers and Sisters, first I want to thank you for the privilege of attending Annual Conference as a representative of Trinity United Methodist Church. I am honored that you gave me this opportunity.

I know that usually the reports are given verbally during the worship services, but I wanted to include more information than a 1–2-minute talk would allow. However, in my first draft of my report it was over 4 pages single space. Too much to ask Debbie to put in the newsletter and too much to ask you to read. So, after much editing, here's my report.

Over the two and half days of the Annual Conference there were many different activities, including conducting some business. Members of the Baltimore-Washington Conference joined United Methodists from across the globe in voting for four proposed amendments to the church's constitution. To take effect in the church, two-thirds of the aggregate vote on each amendment from every Annual Conference needs to be achieved. Thus, every vote counts, however, the vote results won't be known until November. We also voted on a series of eight resolutions. All eight passed and are a series of widely diverse measures that address matters within the church and around the world.

We heard reports from various committees, and we celebrated various ministries throughout the Annual Conference. Awards were given to many churches and individuals. We also got the Stewardship Reports and voted on some recommendations from the Council on Finance and Administration. There was discussion and debate on a few of the items, but in the end, all passed, some with amendments to the recommendations. The budget for the Baltimore-Washington Conference was also passed. The good news for our church is, the percentage churches are apportioned based on their operating expenditures less certain exclusions – is set at 17.25 percent in 2025, a drop from 17.40 percent. We also prayed for 6 churches that are closing this year.

The highlights of the Annual Conference for me were the worship services and the Bible Study each morning. There was a session for laity that discussed the absence of younger people in our congregations. It was an interesting and thought-provoking presentation. The worship services and bible studies centered around the Philippians scripture and the theme of joy and pain. We heard about "trauma-informed joy" and how we can stand firm in the Lord and dwell in joy. I was inspired and affirmed in my faith.

There was a Service of Remembrance to honor 38 servants. Those remembered consisted of clergy, clergy spouses, and clergy children. I felt honored to attend. We also celebrated 20 retirees. Their combined years of service was 604 years. Quite a testimony to those of us in the room.

Then we got to the most rewarding part of the Annual Conference, the Ordination and Commissioning Worship Service. What a joy to participate in celebrating years of dedication and hard work with those folks. Two Deacons and three Elders were commissioned as provisional members and two Deacons, and nine Elders were ordained. To witness their joy was contagious. I am honored that I got to share that rewarding moment with them as they continue to step out in perseverance and faith.

It was a full session of the Annual Conference, and I truly found it rewarding in so many ways. I look forward to future Annual Conferences and reporting back the many wonderful things that our Baltimore-Washington Conference is doing.
