### **Pastor Jim on Sabbath Leave**

Trinity's Senior Pastor Jim Swecker will be on Sabbath Leave from January 3 through February 3, 2022.

The purpose of this type of leave for full-time clergy is for rest, renewal and according to Baltimore-Washington Conference UMC policy, "for clergy to help restore perspective on God-given tasks, to bring a sense of appreciation for themselves and their church and to assist in the restoration of effectiveness and balance in ministry." The Baltimore-Washington Conference recommends this Sabbath Leave for full-time clergy every seventh year—Pastor Jim has been under pastoral appointment 37.5 years and has never had a Sabbath Leave.

Pastor Jim has accepted this recommended leave, which was approved by the District Superintendent, Trinity's Staff-Parish Relations Committee and the Church Council. He looks forward to doing some study of other churches, interviewing other senior pastors, getting away from the pressures and demands of ministry these days and restfully restoring his spirit and his calling to serve.

During this time of leave, Pastor Jim is to have no contact with Trinity UMC or be involved in any of her activities. Pastor Emeritus Rev. Rob Carter will be handling pastoral care while Administrative Assistant Kathy Pinkowski will be in charge of administrative duties. If you have any questions or want to talk about this leave and how it affects the church, please feel free to contact Pastor Jim directly or the SPRC chairpersons (Jim Levin and Vicki Ganley).

### **Christian Education at Trinity**



Happy New Year! I pray that 2022 is a huge blessing to you and your family!

A new year always brings new challenges and new opportunities to try to do better. So, 2022 will bring some changes to our Christian Education program with our children, specifically for those in Pre K-5<sup>th</sup> grade.

This month, we will begin a year-long study using <u>The New City Catechism</u>. Most people associate the term catechism with the Roman Catholic Church, but it is more than that. Merriam-Webster's dictionary definition of catechism is:

"1: oral instruction

2: a manual for catechizing (see CATECHIZE\_SENSE 1)specifically : a summary of religious doctrine often in the form of questions and answers
3a: a set of formal questions put as a test
3b: something resembling a catechism especially in being a rote response or formulaic statement: The cook often consulted the latest nutritional catechism for advice."

The <u>New City Catechism</u> consists of 52 questions and answers regarding the Christian Faith. Each week, the children will focus on one question. This will help our children learn how to have a good, solid relationship with Jesus Christ. If anyone should question their faith, they will be able to answer those persons with confidence in what they believe and why.

Deuteronomy 6:4-9 says loud and clear what we are to do for our children and the children we love. "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. **You**

shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates."

Now that we are living in what people are calling a post Christian culture, our children need to be prepared to meet the challenges that are coming their way. Christian Educators are now making plans for the year 2050 by looking at different ways to help our children be strong, confident leaders in the future. Just think, 2050 is only 28 years from now and our infants and toddlers will be old enough to be church leaders. They will be facing issues we never dreamed of and their faith will be challenged more than ours has been. We want to make our children "resilient disciples" of Jesus Christ.

In her book, <u>Resilient: Child Discipleship and the Fearless Future of the Church</u>, Valerie Bell defines resilient as, "A quality describing the spiritual elasticity of a child or adult. The resilient strength to bend and flex, but not break against the weight of culture." She also describes "Resilient Child Discipleship as, "The process of a Christ-follower committing meaningful, intentional and consistent time and space to a child or a group of children so that they may know who Jesus is, are known by a body of believers (Belong), to place their faith in Jesus, apply the Word of God (Believe), and to reproduce their own discipleship (Become), so that a third spiritual generation can lead and love like Jesus Christ." We want this for our children and the future of the church.

Current research is showing that every resilient child needs to have 1-3 caring adults in their lives. These individuals take a special interest in getting to know each child personally, their likes and dislikes; hopes and fears; dreams and life goals. The more people take an interest in mentoring our young people, the more successful they will become. We want them to know that God loves them, cares for them and wants the best for them. As adults, parents, grandparents, aunts, and uncles, we have the opportunity to be that important influence in their lives that teach them the importance of faith and a relationship with Jesus Christ. Let's help our children find a place they will always belong, where they can believe in Jesus Christ and learn to become more like Jesus.

# 1. Worship Weekly

1. **Worship Weekly** (not weakly): Being a disciple of Jesus means regularly and faithfully worshiping the Lord to stay connected to Him and His people. Illness or out of town obligations can often prevent us from being with the Church when it gathers on Sundays, and we understand this. Our goal is to be as faithful as possible being in God's house for worship. The scripture says Jesus Himself worshiped regularly.

SCRIPTURE: Luke 4: 16-17 and Hebrews 10: 24-25

2. **Meet Monthly**: Become part of a Bible Study or some other small group. Followers of Jesus study His word, not in isolation, but with the help of other disciples seeking to be closer, deeper and more effective. You may want to participate in your Bible Study or small group more than monthly, but at least consider this minimum standard for keeping your life with Christ fresh, active, living and growing.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 119: 105, Acts 2: 42-47, 2 Timothy 3: 14-16, Hebrews 10: 24-25 and Matthew 18: 15-20

3. <u>Serve Seriously</u>: Serving others is a part of following Jesus in the world. Serving the needs of other people and witnessing to the love of Christ are part of the same motion, taking the Gospel outward into the world. Witnessing is a part of serving and spreading the good news of Jesus happens as we feed the hungry. Faith without works is dead, so an active, growing, vibrant faith must have SERVING as a regular component. We recommend serving locally at least 4 times per year (every 3 months) and ask you to consider serving outside our local community once each year, if possible.

SCRIPTURE: Acts 2: 32-37; Psalm 100: 2a and Matthew 28: 16-20




